ENCROACHING PLANTS? • Grasses and other brush are competing with your native seedlings for sun, water, & nutrients. You can release your seedlings by cutting back or clearing 3-5ft around the base of the plant. Release assistance may be available in mid-July. Contact the SWC office with inquiries.
