



Siuslaw Watershed Council Accomplishments in 2013 include:

- Large wood structures were placed in more than **7 miles of stream**, improving aquatic habitat for coho, chinook, and many other species far into the future.
- More than **119 riparian acres** were planted or maintained and invasive plants were removed from **2.7 miles of stream bank**, advancing the establishment of native riparian plants which will increase future stream shading, filtering of nutrients, and large wood recruitment.
- **Over 50 acres of native plants were planted by 109 riparian landowner volunteers** along streams and lakes in the Siuslaw Watershed and Coastal Lakes.

- **More than 490 youth** learned about watershed health and participated in restoration in the SWC Camp and through partnerships with Mapleton, Siuslaw, and Crow-Applegate-Lorane schools.
- Adult and youth volunteers **monitored 12 sampling sites** monthly for nine water quality parameters.
- **Local contractors and businesses, including tree fallers, heavy equipment operators, log truck drivers, surveyors, and nurseries have received business as a result of SWC projects.**
