TREES

Black cottonwood. Grows to 150' tall. Prefers moist soil and full sun but is very tolerant. Winter buds very resinous and fragrant (balsam odor).

Western red cedar. Grows to 200'. Mostly grows in wet soils, usually in shaded forests; grows best on seepage and alluvial sites but also occurs in drier habitats.

Grand fir. Grows to 250'. Adaptable with regard to soil. Usually in full sun or partial shade. Odor of oranges when crushed.

Big leaf maple. Grows over 75' tall on moist sites in full sun and partial shade. Grows rapidly from 5-15 years old.

Oregon Ash. Grows 40-80' in sun or partial shade. Survives standing water in winter months.

Cascara. Grows up to 50' but also may stay smaller. Sun or shade in moist yet well-drained soils.

Bitter cherry. Grows to 50' in sun or partial shade. Best on moist, well-drained sites but also found on dry, exposed sites. Small, clustered flowers, each with five white petals.



Serviceberry. Usually 20-30' tall. Sun or part shade in most soils. Stabilizes slopes.

SHRUBS continued...

Salmonberry. 3-10' shrub forms thickets in sunny and shady wetter sites. Edible shoots and berries. Prickly branches.

Blue elderberry. Large shrub up to 30' tall is often found on sunny, moist forest edges.

Tall Oregon grape. 3-10' shrub found in partial or full shade. Grows best in moist, well -drained, acidic soil. Leaves turn bronze to reddish-purple in winter.

Coast black gooseberry. 3-10 feet tall and found on sunny streambanks. Stout spines on branches.

Mockorange. 5-10' tall and found in dappled understory conditions. Thrives in most conditions. Fragrant, white flowers. One gallon pots; limited to 2 per request.

Willow. 3-foot cuttings. Pacific and Sitka willow harvested in the Siuslaw area. All prefer wetter soils.



Wapato. Edges of streams and lakes, pools, ditches. Showy white flowers and arrowshaped (sagittate) leaves.

Pink fawn lily. Nodding pink perennial with large wavy leaves found in open woods.

Trillium. Small elegant perennial grows in partial or full sunlight and rich soil.

Seaside daisy/Fleabane. Perennial daisy that grows on beaches and coastal bluffs. Limited.

FORBS continued...

Coastal/Beach strawberry. Grows in full and partial light in well-drained soils. Great as ground cover. Found in coastal environments.
